ANZAC COMMEMORATION AT SEAFORD RSL

Each year the Seaford RSL have a school commemoration for ANZAC Day and this year was the 100 year anniversary of the landing at Gallipoli. Mrs Vinocuroff spoke of how the war affected schools, students and families here in Australia and the sense of pride in "doing our bit" for the people on the battlefront. She outlined how students collected iron, sold produce, made craft items to raise money for the war effort; how women could continue to work as teachers after they married due to the shortage of men; how children and women helped with the harvest and the shortage of materials for schools. Ryan and Maddie lay our wreath which was a stunning display of poppies made by the children in the art room. It was a moving and reflective event.
